Engaging Our Students on the Importance of Civic Responsibility

More than 250 student government/council members from Catholic high schools throughout the Archdiocese of New York participated in the second Annual Student Leadership Summit at the Sheen Center in Manhattan on March 5. The students engaged in thoughtful dialogue on the importance of civic engagement through the lens of Catholic social teaching with an impressive panel of experts and leaders. This critical and timely conversation was infused with guidance found in the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops document, "Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship." As a follow-up to the event, student leaders from each of the participating schools will be invited to a field trip to Washington, D.C. in June, touring a number of our national civic and religious institutions, including the U.S. Capitol, the Supreme Court and the Museum of the Bible.

Chaplaincy Program

The Office of the Superintendent is collaborating with our Catholic Identity Advisory Council and the Office of Catholic Identity to implement an exciting new chaplaincy program for our regional schools. Priests and other religious figures will be appointed to serve as a chaplain at select regional schools that may benefit from additional religious presence. The goal of the program is to ensure every school has access to pastoral and spiritual guidance benefiting from their partnership to enhance Catholic identity and infuse religious values into the curriculum. A pilot program will begin this May. During the 2018 school year, additional schools may be added to the program.

Students will head to Capuchin Youth and Family Ministries in Garrison August 5–10, teaming up to work for programs like Habitat for Humanity, senior living facilities and homeless shelters.
