Principals of Tomorrow Participate in the Curran Catholic School Leader Academy

Almost two dozen college students participating in the Curran Catholic School Leader Academy will train to become Catholic school principals on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>February 23rd</u>, <u>2019</u>, <u>from 8:30 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. at the New York Catholic Center</u>, <u>Dillon Hall (20th Floor)</u>, <u>1011 First Avenue</u>, <u>New York</u>, <u>NY</u>, <u>10022</u>.

Students from Fordham University and the University of Notre Dame will learn how to lead a Catholic school by listening to keynote speakers and participating in workshops and panels led by experts in education and child development. The Curran Fellows will also present a project they have prepared called the Colloquium which focuses on customer service, customer care and the overall customer experience models to be implemented at a Catholic school.
