Each team addresses challenging financial, market, social, and design issues. They develop a proforma, and create a three dimensional model of their plan. The teams then present their urban plan to the "city council members" made up of ULI volunteers.

Albertus Magnus Spends Two Days at Regeneron DNA Learning Center

Mrs. Arellano's AP Bio students spent two days at Regeneron DNA Learning Center where they performed the Human DNA Fingerprint with Bioinformatics, DNA Restriction Analysis, and Bacterial Transformation Labs. In the Human DNA Fingerprint Lab, students prepared samples of their own DNA, conducted a PCR to amplify the targeted locus on chromosome 16 for ALU insertion, and performed gel electrophoresis to determine the presence or absence of this ALU gene. Class data was then used to explore the allele frequencies and population genetics as well as identify classmates who share this common gene from tens of thousands of years ago.

Students from Mount St. Michael Academy's science classes recently participated in "disaster drills" at Montefiore Hospital. Our students played the part of patients brought to the Emergency Room after a disaster. Not only did the hospital staff get to "practice," but our students saw first-hand what medical professionals have to do when such a disaster does occur.
