





March for Life

Stepinac Senior Accepted to Notre Dame

Donal Connaughton, a senior at Stepinac High School, has been accepted to attend the University of Notre Dame. A member of the Stepinac's groundbreaking Susan and Daniel P. Mahoney Health Sciences Honors Academy, Connaughton is also taking courses in bioethics, epidemiology, behavioral neuroscience, advanced patient care, and genetics. For his AP Research dissertation, he is studying the rise of nationalist parties in Ireland and Scotland.

Among his other several achievements and accolades, Connaughton is VP of student government and captain of the Crusaders cross-country team. He is the first-ever Stepinac student to win three consecutive gold medals in the National Latin Exam and is seeking a fourth win. Cardinal Spellman's Girls' Freshman Cross-Country Team competed exceptionally well at the City Championships, ranking number two in the city! The girls finished second in the City Championship by only 4 points. Finishing in the top ten for the NY section were Geneva Austin (1st), Sarahi Paulino (2nd), and Brianna Soto (8th).

The team that rounded out the top 15 spots for the NY section were Gabrielle Taylor, Angelique Alexander, Brianna Rodriguez, and Kathleen Le. This is the first time in Spellman athletics history that the freshmen crosscountry girls have finished in the top 3 of a CHSAA City Championship.



Albertus Magnus' All American Honors

On October 21st, Albertus Magnus students held a dress down day in which they raised approximately \$1,800 in support of Wreaths Across America, an organization that honors veterans by raising money to purchase wreaths and placing them at deceased veterans' gravesites across the country.
