Cardinal Hayes Football Team Makes New York History

On December 21, 2023, the Office of Bronx Borough President, Vanessa Gibson, hosted a gala to celebrate the New York State Catholic High School Football Championship won by the Cardinal Hayes High School Varsity Football Squad on December 2, 2023. The Cardinal Hayes Football Cardinals have been playing football since the school opened in 1941 and in a historical moment became the first team from the five boroughs of New York City to win the New York State Catholic High School League title.

In her remarks on the accomplishments of the young men, Ms. Gibson reveled in the success of the program. Ms. Gibson was joined by former New York Jet Tony Richardson, who was most impressed with the success of the Hayes football program. There was also a congratulatory message from the New York Jets head coach Robert Saleh. The players were presented with certificates of merit from the Bronx Borough President's Office and a Proclamation proclaiming December 2nd as Cardinal Hayes High School Football Recognition Day.


Notre Dame School Alumni Return to Mentor Class of 2025
