Our schools follow the guidance of their local health departments, with the goal of keeping schools open as long as it is in the best interest of our students and faculty.

Current recommendations for schools are the following:

- ▶ Masks are optional. We recommend that all school community members

wear them, but they are not required. We shall always respect and support everyone's personal choices.

- ▶ Parents will no longer be required to submit daily health checks.

Families are reminded that all regular childhood immunizations, which are separate and distinct from COVID-19 vaccinations, must be received before the start of school under State Law. This is outlined in the [school handbook](#).

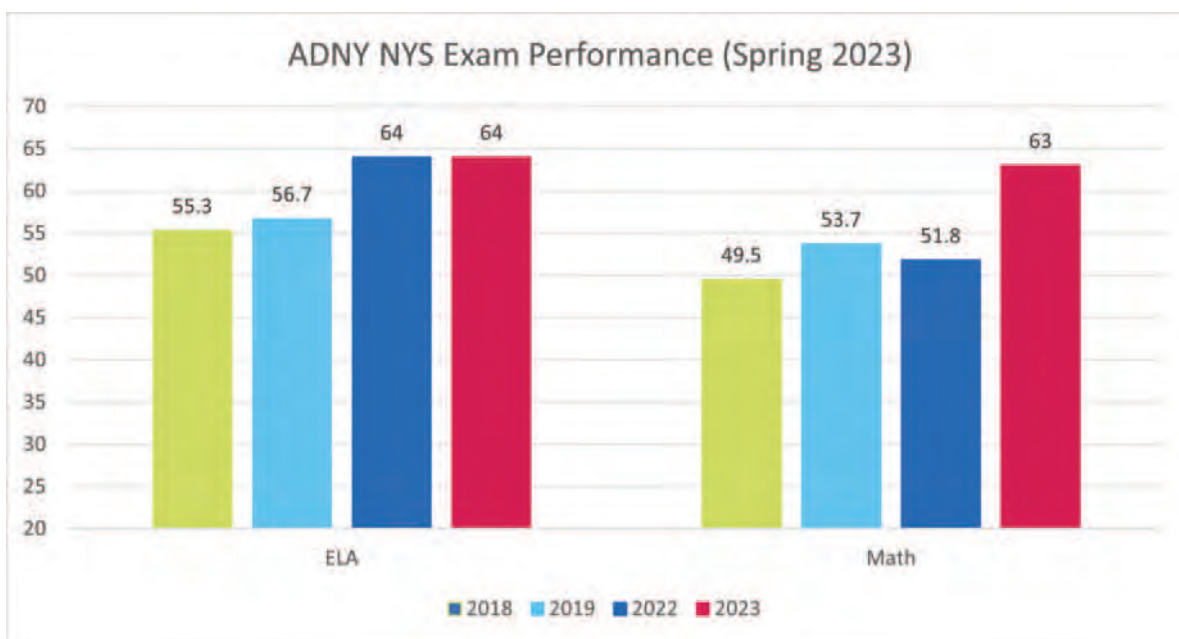
Elementary School (Grades 1-8)

In addition to Math, Religion, English/Language/Arts, History and Science, our schools have expanded technology and STEM programs, introduced robust literacy tools, and evolved art programs to stimulate creativity in young minds. Serving Students with Special Needs

We are committed to providing children with learning disabilities (LD), other health impairments (OHI), and speech or language impairment (SPL) with resources that are comparable to those available in local public schools. Prior to admission, the Principal meets with parents to evaluate the child and decide on an approach that best meets the child's needs.



From our last testing period in 2023, our English Language Arts (ELA) scores have remained steady, while our Math scores improved by 11 percentage points, demonstrating that the proactive steps we took to keep our schools open and safe has made the difference in preventing the pandemic-induced learning loss seen at many other schools.

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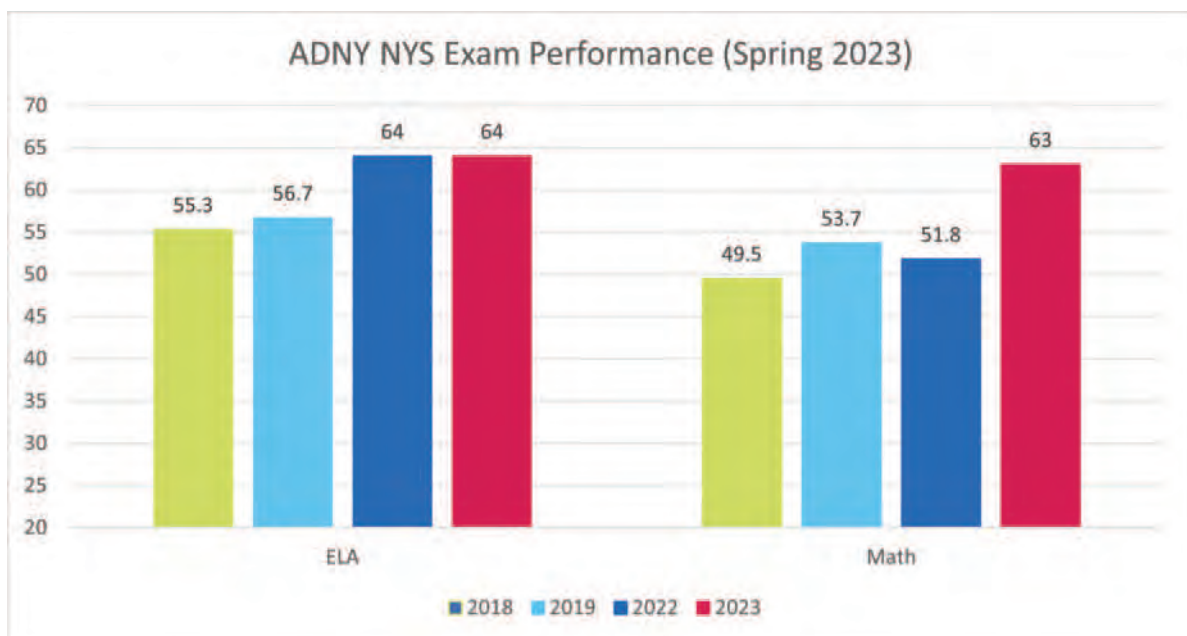
Parent Support.
