Cardinal Spellman "S" Award Recipients


Seventy-five Spellman Seniors received the Circle S Award, in honor of completing 120 hours of service during high school. In total this group has over 9,000 service hours.

MISSION

The primary focus at the Iona Preparatory School is to nurture and empower young men by teaching faith, building community, serving others, and pursuing excellence. Iona Prep accepts students with the academic potential to succeed in a rigorous college prep program, and who are willing to challenge themselves in a variety of academic and extracurricular pursuits.

The Options Program is designed with the belief that all young men, including those with mild to moderate disabilities should have the option of an Iona Preparatory education. Its purpose is to meet the needs of a unique set of learners in an effort to embrace the spirit of the Iona Prep man: heart, mind, body, and soul. The focus of the program is to provide academic, social, and spiritual growth for each student in order for them to be successful and independent adults in the future.

CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

A challenging curriculum, a welcoming community, a caring and dedicated faculty, and the building of life-long friendships are hallmarks of lona Prep.

The mission of the program is to prepare students for life after high school. There are many choices for students upon completion of the Options Program. Throughout the student's four years in the program, they will work on a Life Skills curriculum with the goal of becoming independent and productive members of our community.

We recognize the importance of setting students up for a successful transition into adulthood, including preparation for independent living and job training.

The curriculum of the Options Program is centered on developing the students' skills in English and Mathematics. Our faculty conducts these classes in a smaller setting where they use a variety of hands-on-activities, cooperative learning, and interactive technologies to meet each student's needs.



Maria Regina HS Earns College Board's Coveted "AP Gold with Access Honor Roll" Ranking

Maria Regina was among only 7% of eligible public and private high schools nationwide—and the only all-girls high school in Westchester and one of only two high schools in the entire Archdiocese of New York Secondary Schools System—to achieve the Gold level with Access.

The renowned all-girls Catholic high school also distinguished itself by achieving the "with access" award. Principal Maria Carozza-McCaffrey (Class of '99) said that the distinction "honors high schools that demonstrate a clear commitment to giving students equitable access to advanced coursework with no restrictions on who can enroll in an AP course."
