## PLEASE NOTE:

Principals must submit a school calendar to their regional superintendent that includes 180 days in 25-26; no more than five of those days should be conference days, with at least one conference day focused on spirituality.

Schools are allowed up to a maximum of 11 plus 2 early dismissal days to be used for professional development and/or faculty meetings. The graduation date for eighth-grade classes should be no earlier than one week before the last day of school.

#### **VARIANCES FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT'S CALENDAR:**

Elementary schools seeking a variance must contact their Regional Superintendent at least 10 days in advance. They must include the date(s) on which the lost instructional time will be made up.

### **BUSING NOTICE: SCHOOLS IN NEW YORK CITY ONLY:**

Nonpublic general education yellow bus schools can choose to receive GE bus service for a total of seven days when the DOE schools will be closed. Under NYS Education Law, five of these are identified as "alternate days" when the public schools will be closed. Those days may be selected from among the following: the day after Labor Day, Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, or days during the DOE winter recess, mid-winter recess, or spring recess.

In addition, under NYC policy, these schools may also choose to receive bus service on an additional day when the DOE schools will be closed as long as the total number of days for the year does not exceed 180.

## **INCLEMENT WEATHER**

Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of New York follow the policy of local public schools when closing due to inclement weather, loss of power, or other issues.

Catholic schools on Staten Island, in the Bronx, and in Manhattan may find it necessary to make closure decisions independently of the NYC public schools based on local situations. However, any local decisions to close due to inclement weather or other issues must be approved by the Regional Superintendent and Superintendent of Schools.

Schools in Westchester, Putnam, and the Upper Counties that rely on public school districts for bus transportation will follow the local district's delayed opening or closing policy.

Some schools needing additional snow days may be open on days the rest of the Archdiocesan schools are closed to account for the 180 days. However, any local decisions to close due to inclement weather or other issues must be approved by the Regional Superintendent and Superintendent.
